Shortly after MilkWorks opened in 2001, the complex interconnection between breastfeeding and maternal mental health became apparent. Several national reports and research studies have shown that postpartum depression may reduce rates of breastfeeding. Conversely, not engaging in breastfeeding (or perceiving failure with breastfeeding) may increase the risk of postpartum depression. Because of the interweaving of breastfeeding and postpartum depression, MilkWorks has found that while our clients initially reach out for lactation support, many if not most are also dealing with the more complex mental health challenges associated with childbirth.

Mom Talk is lead by a MilkWorks Breastfeeding Educator and is a safe place for new moms to land. There are opportunities to weigh their babies, discuss the ups and downs of parenthood, share information, and make new and meaningful friendships.

Weekly groups meet on Tuesdays at both our Lincoln and Omaha locations from 9:30-11am. Everyone is welcome, and there is no fee to attend.

Our mission is to create a healthier community by empowering families to reach their breastfeeding goals. MilkWorks provides clinical lactation consultations as well as a variety of free resources and services at our two locations in Lincoln and Omaha. Virtual classes and telehealth appointments are available to accommodate the needs of each family.

Pump Access Program
